COMPUTER PROGRAMMING

This year-long program introduces students to basic programming concepts as well as problem solving using various programming languages. Students who complete both Year 1 and Year 2 will earn certificates in C# Application Developer and Java Application Developer. Students will earn 12 DMACC college credits in Year 1 and another 12 credits by completing Year 2. This program will help lead into a Diploma in Computer Languages and then an Associate Degree in Computer Information Systems. This program will be hosted in our computer lab on campus with a lab assistant and taught virtually from another campus. Year 2 of the program will be provided online only.
