In the late 1970s, DMACC offered speakers, free of charge, to area groups and organizations as a community service. According to Rudy Harris, the idea originated in the Arts and Sciences Department, but soon faculty and staff from across the college participated. Speakers would present for 15 - 20 minutes for breakfast, lunch, or dinner meetings. A wide range of topics were available including creativity, communication, horticulture, bicycles, finances, humor, family, management, DMACC, and many more. Don Bell was the promotion specialist for the project.
