## What can I do until I start the nursing program?

• Take any of the liberal arts courses required in the nursing curriculum. Taking the liberal arts courses will reduce your course load once you are admitted to the program and will give you more time to devote to your nursing courses. However, if insurance or financial aid requires you to be enrolled as a full-time (12 credits or more) student, you'll need to take this into consideration when planning how many courses to take each term.
